you have bathed... (4:43)

Full Ayah: Believers, do not approach your prayers when you are drunk, until you understand

what you say, nor when you are in a state of impurity, —except when you are on a journey—till you have bathed. And if you are ill, or on a journey or have relieved yourselves or when you have consorted with women and you cannot find any water, then find some clean sand and wipe your face and your hands with it. God

is gracious and forgiving. (4:43)

6. Namaz Reference:cannot find any water, then find some clean sand and wipe your face and

your hands with it... (4:43)

7. Namaz Reference: (Allah's Respect) I am your Lord! Take off your sandals... (20:12)

Full Ayah: I am your Lord! Take off your sandals, for you are in the sacred valley of

QIBLA: SACRED MOSQUE
